A—Make a ring of (4 double knots, picot) 3 times, 4 double knots, close; chain 4 double knots, picot, 4 double knots; repeat until there are 6 rings, each joined to previous; chain 4 double knots, and make ring as before, 2 double knots, ring as before, but do not attach to anything; chain 4 double knots, and continue as for opposite side. Chain 4 double knots, picot, 4 double knots, fasten in 3d picot of last ring made, chain (4 double knots, picot) twice, 4 double knots, and fasten in 2d picot of same ring; continue with chain of 4 double knots, picot, 4 double knots, joining to picot of next ring, until joining to upper ring has been made; then chain (4 double knots, picot) twice, 4 double knots; then make a ring of 5 double knots, fasten to end picot of last ring, 4 double knots, fasten to end picot of opposite ring, 5 double knots, close; chain (4 double knots, picot) twice, 4 double knots, fasten to 2d picot of last ring joined; continue as on other side and fasten off. Attach thread to 1st picot at top of inside chains, chain 2 double knots, make ring as before, fastening to next lower picot of side, chain 4 double knots, another ring fastened to previous one and to other side by 3d picot; chain 2 double knots and fasten to next picot above, fasten off. Attach thread to next lower picot on one side, chain 4 double knots, fasten to picot of ring, 4 double knots, picot, 4 double knots, fasten to next ring, 4 double knots, fasten to opposite side.

B—Make a ring of (4 double knots, picot) 3 times, 4 double knots, close; chain 4 double knots, picot, 4 double knots; repeat until there are 7 rings, each joined to previous; (4 double knots, ring) twice, (4 double knots, picot, 4 double knots, ring) twice, (4 double knots, ring) 4 times, (4 double knots, picot, 4 double knots, ring) twice, this last ring is joined by 3d picot to 4th picot of chain—counting from beginning; 4 double knots and fasten to next picot above. Attach thread to 3d picot, counting from starting point, 4 double knots, fasten to picot of last ring made, (4 double knots, picot, 4 double knots, fasten to next picot) twice, (4 double knots, picot, 4 double knots, fasten to next picot, (4 double knots, picot, 4 double knots, fasten to next picot) twice, (4 double knots, picot, 4 double knots, fasten to next picot, (4 double knots, picot, 4 double knots, fasten to next picot) 3 times, (4 double knots, picot) twice, 4 double knots, fasten to next picot, (4 double knots, picot, 4 double knots, fasten to next picot, (4 double knots, picot, 4 double knots, fasten to next picot) 6 times; this brings the work to the 1st ring made, 4 double knots, picot, 4 double knots, fasten to 3d picot of that ring; 4 double knots, picot, 4 double knots, ring as before, fastening 1st picot to point of first starting, (4 double knots, picot, 4 double knots, ring) 3 times, * (4 double knots, picot) twice, 4 double knots, ring, repeat from * 3 times, attaching 3d picot of last ring to 3d picot, counting from last fastening off; 4 double knots, picot, 4 double knots, fasten to next picot of chain. Attach thread to 2d picot of inside chain, (4 double knots, picot, 4 double knots, fasten to picot of next ring) twice, (2 double knots, fasten to next picot) 3 times, (4 double knots, picot, 4 double knots, fasten to next picot) 3 times, 2 double knots, and fasten to picot of chain first made.

woolens washed, or dry-cleaned, and moth-proofed before storing for the summer. Materials that are free from eggs and larvae, but are not moth-proofed, should be wrapped securely in strong paper or boxes and made air tight by sealing all openings with gummed tape, as they are liable to infestation.

MOTHs are usually more difficult to eradicate from furniture, rugs and draperies than from clothing. Go over your furniture regularly with your hand vacuum or cleaner attachments and pay careful attention to the seams, folds and trimmings of the upholstery, under cushions, and at the bottom where moths are likely to enter the padding. Mohair in particular, needs close attention. Take plenty of time to do the dusting thoroughly. Because moths are attracted to soiled spots, remove stains with a non-flammable solvent. Moths may be working undisturbed in the dark, confined places under your lovely slip covers; frequently remove the covers in warm weather, dust the furniture, and carefully vacuum the upholstery.

Spraying the furniture coverings with an effective moth-proofing solution offers excellent protection if the work is done well and carefully. This work may be done at home with one of the reputable products, or experts may be engaged who will come into the home and moth-proof the furniture and floor coverings, relieving you of all worry concerning moth disaster. Routine care will always win the battle with moths, and an ounce of prevention is worth many times its

weight in caring for upholstered furniture. If moths do get under the covering of your furniture, the wisest course is to have the furniture treated by a reliable company that is prepared to fumigate it effectively.

CLEAN your rugs and carpets thoroughly with the vacuum cleaner as a moth-preventive measure. Systematically clean strip after strip of the rug in one direction and then repeat the process in the opposite length or width of the rug. Often change the position of your furniture so that a heavy, low piece such as a sofa or couch, does not remain in one place for weeks, because these dark places are exactly the spots that moths appropriate. Rug pads that are moth-proofed are also of enormous help in reducing the hazards from these household enemies. Before storing floor coverings, have them well cleaned and use plenty of moth-proofing compound or a fumigant and wrap them in strong paper or put them in a tightly closed box or other container.

Many good moth-control products may now be had that are designed to give protection for the numerous articles in the home that moths attack. Buy products from reliable dealers only and use them exactly according to the directions on the package. Moth-proofing sprays should repel or cause the destruction of the moth, be without objectionable odor, and be of a type that will not discolor nor injure the fabric; they should also saturate evenly and adhere to the material and not be injurious to humans either by contact or by breathing; naphthalene or paradichloro-benzene that give off a strong vapor have a deadly effect on the moth if they are used in airtight containers and in sufficient quantity. Containers that release strong vapors are available for use in closets or chests.

Fasten thread to picot of last ring made, chain 4 double knots, fasten into

picot of 2d ring made; (4 double knots, picot, 4 double knots, fasten into next picot) 5 times, 2 double knots, fasten in next picot, (4 double knots, picot, 4 double knots, fasten into next picot) twice, (4 double knots, fasten in next picot) twice, (4 double knots, picot, 4 double knots, fasten in next picot) 5 times, (4 double knots, fasten in next picot) twice, (4 double knots, picot, 4 double knots, fasten in next picot) twice, fasten off.

E—*Make a ring of (4 double knots, picot) 3 times, 4 double knots, close; chain 4 double knots, picot, 4 double knots; repeat from * 3 times; ring, (4 double knots, picot) twice, 4 double knots, fasten in 3d picot of last ring, (4 double knots, picot, 4 double knots, ring) 6 times, (4 double knots, picot) twice, 4 double knots, fasten in 3d picot of last ring; (4 double knots, picot, 4 double knots, ring) 4 times, 4 double knots, picot, 4 double knots, fasten in 3d picot of last ring, 4 double knots, fasten in 2d picot of same ring, (4 double knots, picot, 4 double knots, fasten in next picot) 3 times; 4 double knots, fasten in next picot; 4 double knots, picot, 4 double knots, fasten in next picot; 4 double knots, ring fastening to picot of middle ring at back of letter; (4 double knots, picot, 4 double knots, ring) twice; 4 double knots, picot, 4 double knots, fasten in 3d picot of last ring, 4 double knots, picot, 4 double knots, fasten in 2d picot of same ring; continue with chains, as for lower part of letter, to the starting point, and fasten off.

turning the edges a little beyond the indicated line and working the knot stitch all around as if topping a hem.

DESK Blotter: Cut two strips of light-weight flexible cardboard the exact size of the embroidered panels, measuring from the edge turns. Pencil around mounts on lining material and cut about one-half inch beyond. Turn edges on, pencil lines and press, press damask in same way and top-sew together over mounts, holding in place with pins. Use sewing thread matching color of damask and take tiny straight stitches that will sink into the texture, making sure covering fits mount snugly. Edge all around with double knot stitch.

For back cover a heavier cardboard twelve and one-fourth by nineteen inches on both sides with sateen and top-sew a panel to each end. Finish with knot stitch across top and bottom between panels.

PORTFOLIO: Get two eleven by fourteen and one-fourth inch paste-board panels one-sixteenth inch thick for covers. Cover on both sides with outing flannel, gluing it lightly in place. Do not overlap edges.

F—Follow the directions for the letter E, omitting the lower arm.

G—Make foundation as for letter C, omitting two side rings. Attach thread to side picot of last ring made, 4 double knots, picot, 4 double knots, leave tiny space to attach picot; 4 double knots, picot, 4 double knots, ring, fastening 1st picot in space allowed and 2d picot in picot where thread was attached; (4 double knots, picot, 4 double knots, ring with picots fastening to previous ring and to main structure) twice; 4 double knots, picot, 4 double knots, fasten to 3d picot of last ring made, 4 double knots, picot, 4 double knots, fasten to corner picot of main structure.

Cut lining with penciled outlines (as described for desk blotter). Turn edges of damask and lining and cover mounts. Close on three sides, leaving backs open.

Make back or hinge strip width desired (finish about one inch), allowing a full half inch additional on both long sides. Baste side edges of damask and lining together flat, turn in ends to exact length of covers and knot-stitch. Insert sides under turns of open backs and back-stitch securely, then cover with knot stitch. To finish, working from the inside, turn edge of lining and sew to cover hinge seams.

BOX: This wood box, measuring three and one-half by six and one-half inches and two and one-fourth inches in depth, is useful for pen and pencils, or for cigarettes.

Cover with outing flannel. Do not lap corners or bring flannel close to edges.

Having embroidered motifs on cover and all the double parallel lines, press and cut with one-half inch allowance for corner seams and edge turns. (Do not work edges until mounted on box.) Top-sew corners. Do knot stitch along turned edges, then slip on box. If fit is not snug, remove and apply a second layer of flannel on the box, then glue edges of the damask slips to cover and base. Knot-stitch all edge turns and seams.

The inside of the box may be left unfinished, shellacked or painted in a color to harmonize with the embroidery.

H—*Make a ring of (4 double knots, picot) 3 times, 4 double knots, close; 4 double knots, picot, 4 double knots, repeat from * 6 times, fastening last chain to 3d picot of last ring made; 4 double knots, picot, 4 double knots, fasten to 2d picot of last ring; (4 double knots, picot, 4 double knots, fasten to next picot) twice; 4 double knots, ring fastened to picot of center ring; (4 double knots, picot, 4 double knots, ring fastened to previous ring) twice; 4 double knots, ring, (4 double knots, picot, 4 double knots, ring fastened to previous one) twice; 4 double knots, picot, 4 double knots, fasten to 3d picot of last ring made, 4 double knots, picot, 4 double knots, fasten to 2d picot of same ring; (4 double knots, picot, 4 double knots, fasten to next picot) twice; 4 double knots, picot, 4 double knots, ring fastened to two rings; (4 double knots, picot, 4 double knots, ring) 3 times. Continue with chains as for first half.

New Hardy Chrysanthemum Hybrids

When planting this month for color in the perennial border next October, do not overlook the fine possibilities of the new Korean hybrid chrysanthemums.

The Koreans, which are the newest thing in early and yet thoroughly hardy chrysanthemums, are leaping into popularity. Gardeners everywhere are trying them and then, delighted with the result, are purchasing all they can use.

Order the named varieties if you are planning a border in any special combination of colors. Many are now available, including some splendid brand-new ones. Some are like brilliantly colored daisies. Others have long pointed petals like

gerberas. Still others are semi-double or completely double. The blossoms range from an inch and a half to four inches in diameter. The glorious color range includes everything from pure white to deep crimson. There are shell pinks, pale and deep orchids, rose, carmine and crimson as well as yellow, gold, orange and rust, with beautiful blends of two colors in some of the varieties.

Some Korean hybrids begin to bloom as early as the middle of August. Others are so frost resistant that they will keep on blooming after a freeze which causes ice to form in the hearts of the flowers.

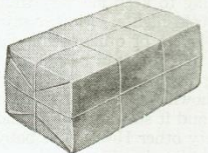

THE group at the right shows three distinct styles, all equally popular. Dresses of plain fabric with bright trimming are decidedly smart. The one at the top is made of bright blue gingham cloth trimmed with red bias bands half an inch wide. It buttons down the front with buttons covered with red. For the belt, three folds of the bias were stitched together. The full skirt, of two widths of fabric, was gathered at the waist with three rows of machine-shirring.

The peasant dress of printed silk with a chiffon blouse was priced at twenty-five dollars. To me it seemed a good idea for a dress of cotton print with a plain blouse. Another dress of this type had a pair of shorts sewed on to the blouse at the waistline, to be worn under the full skirt.

The over-blouse dress at the extreme right with its machine-stitched fabric bows will surely be the school "Ford" of the fall season. Every manufacturer of children's clothes in the middle or upper-price brackets has this style in his line. It is practical, becomingly smart, and ever so easy to make, particularly if the sleeves are short. To wear with a little wool skirt of plain color, you might make blouses in plaid or check for variety, or perhaps three cotton print blouses. The design has possibilities and is one that every girl from eight to sixteen is sure to like.

OUT of a hundred pairs of pajamas, I chose the plain flannel as the smartest, especially for lounging. The "legs," as the girls call them, are of plain color; the jacket of blazer stripes in the brightest possible colors. Most tops slip over the head, have a double collar, two pockets, and a generous tie sash of the fabric. Some have open sleeves, but the smartest have tailored cuffs with links — making an outfit that any girl will adore, one that will give her a feeling of "swank-

iness" that she will thoroughly delight in, especially when there is a three-quarter coat to match the "legs."

The all-over print dress never had a better chance of fashion success in the fall than it has this year. The dress shown is of a synthetic imitation wool that tailors easily. The pointed trim, seen on expensive frocks, is particularly nice for silk, crepe, light-weight wool, or fine cotton. It is easy to do if you make yourself a cardboard guide with three points to mark off the trim on the wrong side. Stitch on the marked lines, pivoting the machine needle at each point so that you make a true turn. Cut the fabric away between the points, clip the ends of the points down near to the stitching, turn and press. Slip-stitch the hem edge as usual. The collar and cuffs and pocket tops are, of course, made double.

Wool crepe, a favorite for fall, comes in lovely bright colors. Make the dress shown with the jacket just as plain as you can — with big buttons, bound buttonholes, a plain short or three-quarter sleeve, a double collar of the fabric, and a contrasting belt. For the blazer jacket, buy the loudest, gayest plaid or check you can find. Cut the jacket generously, with a shawl collar and no lining.

Because stripes are everywhere — in cottons, flannels, wool crepes, and synthetics — we show a special design typical of those appropriate for stripes — smart short flared skirt, short sleeves, self trim.

NO school wardrobe would be complete without a party dress, especially when we are expecting clothes to bring charm, beauty, and happiness. The one shown has all the fashion features that are most talked of for the coming season. Note the neckline, sleeve line, front of the bodice, and the plain circular skirt. Many of these skirts are cut ankle length, but the smartest shops are making them to the heel. The bottom edge has a French bias-binding put on by machine. Often the waistline sash hangs to the bottom of the dress in the back.

Artificial flowers are generously used — on the front, on the sleeves, in the hair, sometimes on the bottom of the skirt. They add a festive gaiety, an essential for special-occasion clothes.

Now make a ring and fasten to picot of the center ring, 4 double knots, ring, fastening 1st picot to next picot, 4 double knots, ring, fastening to previous ring; (4 double knots, picot, 4 double knots, ring) 3 times; (4 double knots, picot) twice, 4 double knots, fasten to 3d picot of last ring made; (4 double knots, picot, 4 double knots, fasten to next picot) 3 times; 4 double knots, ring, fastening to next picot; make 3 more rings and the chains as for other part of letter; when the 1st ring of lower arm is reached chain 4 double knots and fasten to 1st ring of upper arm, 4 double knots and fasten to the next picot on back of letter, continue with chains to starting point.

L — Make in the same manner as letter E omitting the upper and middle arms.

and a nice wood brown, all of which may be used with most living-room furnishings. Unbleached knitting cotton was used for the stitchery and the edge turned on the right side and held with

upholstery fringe in the same creamy tone.

Linen, also closely woven but lighter in texture, was used for the luncheon set (No. 37-11-2) and a white twisted cotton used for the stitchery. Edges are finished with three-eighths inch hems.

The chair back will also be found useful as a mat on a living-room table and the runner of the luncheon set may also be made of the colored sail cloth and used in the living room.

each leg and three-fourths inch from one end bend sharply at right angles. Cut a layer of cotton two and one-half by six inches, wrap around cardboard tube once, hold the wires against it, one on each side, with bent angles flush with same end, and continue to wrap cotton as smoothly as possible. Fold back leg strip one-half inch on each long edge, to exact length of leg support, wrap as closely as possible and sew.

Foot: Cover a two and one-half inch cardboard circle to match body. Center leg on uncovered side and mark where wires come on each side of leg. Pierce

cardboard with scissors or awl at these points, insert leg wires from covered side, bending them close to cardboard on inside and sew securely to mount at angles. Then sew leg cover to base. Cover a second two and one-half inch circle and slip-stitch edges together to form a firm foot foundation. Make second leg in same way and pin them in place at opposite sides of gusset. Insert long leg wires through gusset at these places, bend to conform to lengthwise shape of body and sew wire to it securely. Place second leg directly opposite first, then turn in body opening and overcast together. "Husband's" legs are finished with an inch wide band of black next the body.

Overlap the feet sufficiently at center to stand erect and catch the edges together.

Eyes may be made of flat green felt patches, buttonholed in place, or white beads may be used instead.

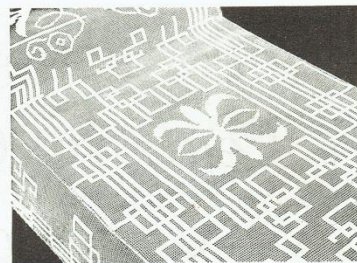

11th decrease round. *Knit 24, knit 25th and 26th stitches together, and repeat around. Knit 2 inches even.

12th decrease round. *Knit 23, knit 24th and 25th stitches together, and repeat around. Knit 2 inches even.

13th decrease round. *Knit 22, knit 23d and 24th stitches together, and repeat around. Knit 2 inches even.

14th decrease round. *Knit 21, knit 22d and 23d stitches together, and repeat around. Knit 1 inch even.

15th decrease round. *Knit 20, knit 21st and 22d stitches together, and repeat around. Bind off.

Using a No. 5 crochet hook work 3

rows of double crochet around bottom of skirt, and 4 rows around waist.

To make the beading for elastic—fasten at base of last row of doubles, chain 5, miss 4 or 5 stitches and fasten in 1st row of doubles, chain 5 and repeat.

THE BELT—Crochet a chain of length desired. Make a double crochet in the 2d stitch from hook, continue with 1 double in each stitch of chain to last stitch, 2 doubles in end stitch, double in each stitch on other side of chain. Work 2 more rows of doubles around (both sides of belt). Then 1 row of trebles, and another row of doubles, and fasten off. Finish belt with a buckle, either plain or covered with crochet.

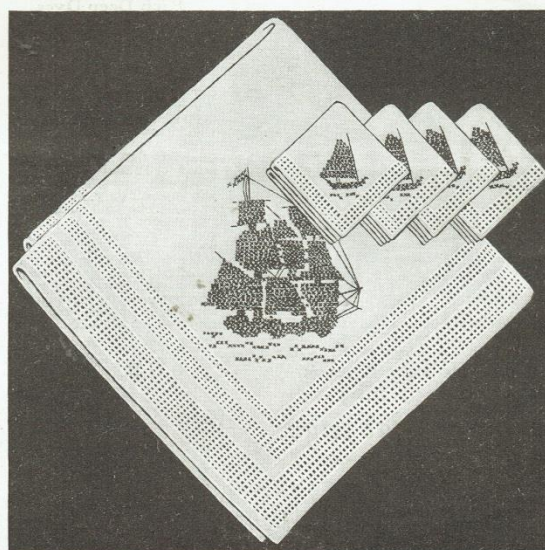
